Epigraph

 Quotation, phrase, poem, lyric, refrain, or reference that precedes a narrative
 Establishes a topol forecasts a

What literary trope is it? Personification

Personification

 Attributing human characteristics to animals, abstract ideas, or inanimate objects as if they were human

Literary Tropes: Personification

What literary trope is it? Onomatopoeia

Onomatopoeia

- A word that imitates or suggests a sound
 For example:
 - Bang, Zap, Boing
 - Fizz, Gurgle, Slurp
 - Beep, Honk, Vroom
 - Hiss, Growl, Cuckoo
 - Pitter-Patter, Tick-Tock

Literary Tropes: Onomatopoeia

Simile

- Comparison using the words 'like' or 'as'
- Makes a concept more lively, compelling, or meaningful

Literary Tropes: Smilie

What literary technique is it? Synecdoche

Synecdoche

- Referring to the parts to describe the whole (or vice versa) or the material from which an object is made
- For example:
 - Paper or plastic?
 - Pour me a glass of bubbly.
 - Tickling the ivories.
 - Cool threads!
 - Nice wheels!

Literary Tropes: Synecdoche

What literary trope is it? Synesthesia

Synesthesia

- A description of one sensesensation expressed in terms of another sense-sensation
- For example:
 - Smooth jazz
 - A black rage
 - Your cold words
 - I smell trouble
 - Symphony in gray minor
 - Skittles: Taste the Rainbow

Literary Tropes: Synesthesia
